I hope you enjoy my story, and that it inspires you to chase after your dreams too!

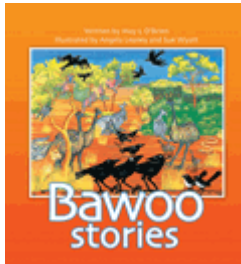


Big rain Coming

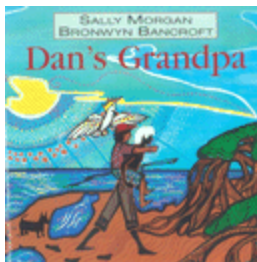

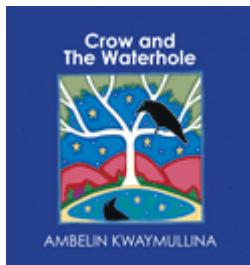

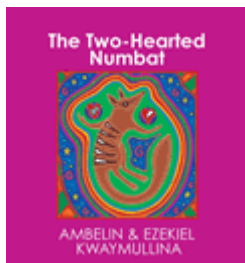


Crow and the Waterhole

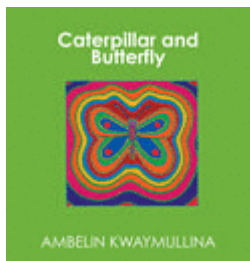


The Two-Hearted Numbat

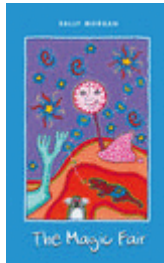

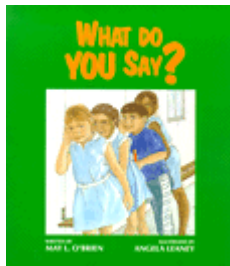

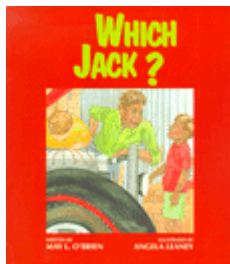
