

PRE-READING QUESTIONS

- 1. Looking at the front cover, what do you think this book is about?
- 2. What do you know about the Matildas football team?
- 3. Consider the subtitle of the book. What makes a good friend?
- 4. What do you think a good team member does?

POST-READING QUESTIONS

- How did reading We Are Matildas make you feel?
- 2. How did the illustrations help to tell the story?
- 3. What made the Little Matildas a great team?



KEY STUDY TOPICS

Goals and Dreams

Jazzy dreams of playing football professionally and being a member of the Matildas football team.

Questions

- Do you think Jazzy's dream of being a Matilda will come true?
- 2. What do you think some of the other characters in the book might dream of doing one day?
- 3. How do you think Jazzy might achieve her goal? What will she have to sacrifice?

Activities

- Write down or draw what you would like to be doing in a year.
- 2. Write down or draw what you would like to be doing in five years.
- Write down or draw what you would like to be doing in 10 years. Pair the kids together and ask them to talk about how they might achieve these goals.
- 4. Dear 9-Year-Old Me letter Watch the following video of the Under-20s Young Matildas players read letters they wrote to their nine-year-old selves. Draw a picture or write a poem about the emotions you felt while watching the video and what you learned about making your dreams come true. Friendship

Jazzy put together her team by including her friends and inviting new students at school.

Questions

- 1. What lessons about friendship did Jazzy learn?
- 2. What makes Jazzy a good friend or teammate?

Activities

- 1. In a group, make a list of words that describe a good friend or team that you can display in the classroom.
- Sit in a circle with your classmates and take turns choosing a word from the lists in the previous activity that best describes yourself and explain why.

Football and Other Activities

Jazzy and her friends play football (or soccer) as well as other sports, take music lessons and complete school work.

Activities

- As a class, write a list of all the sports and other activities the kids participate in within school and outside of school. Discuss how kids feel about participating in these activities and if they sometimes wish they did less/more activities.
- Plan and hold a football tournament at school, run by students for students. Have some fun out there and ask some students to create banners to support their favourite players and teams.
- Have a FIFA Women's World Cup 2023[™] Party at school. Watch games or highlights. Ask students to write a review of a CommBank Matildas' game.
- 4. Ask a local or famous football player to come to your school and talk to the class about their football experience and their journey to becoming a sportsperson.

FURTHER DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- Are you part of a team, or do you have a favourite activity you do with friends? How did it start?
- What are some challenges that you have faced as part of a team?
- Do you have a goal or dream that sounds impossible? What are some steps you can take to achieve your goal?



ADDITIONAL ACTIVITIES

- Make a banner for Jazzy and the Little Matildas, or for your favourite sports team.
- Write a few sentences or give a 30-second speech to your class about which character from the story you are most like and why.
- Research and write player profiles on the Matildas players, like Sam Kerr, Kyah Simon, Ellie Carpenter and other players mentioned in the story. Combine the profiles into a book that can be kept in the school library.
- Discuss how the illustrator has shown the action on the field in the second half of the book. What would this story be like without pictures? Draw a of part of the story that isn't in the book.
- Did you know that the Matildas' team name comes from the folk song 'Waltzing Matilda'? Research other facts about the CommBank Matildas and women's football to display in the classroom.




Football Fever, Book 1: The Kick-Off
